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## The accommodation site distinguished the Périgord commune among the ten of its national awards

In the list of the ten most welcoming rural municipalities in France, Airbnb ranked that of Rouffignac-Saint-Cernin-de-Reilhac, in the Dordogne, alongside the towns of Loir-et-Cher, Jura, Ardèche and 'Alsace. According to their explanations, "they have been recognized by the hosts on Airbnb for the quality of their welcome". This is one of those rankings drawn up subjectively and from internal data by tourism operators, but they are a pleasure when you are distinguished.



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The mayor, Raymond Marty, is delighted with this news. "We communicated a lot about the green station label that we have just obtained and that we will celebrate on May 13 and 14. We insisted a lot on improving the quality of accommodation.

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Even if we are far from the Vézère valley, we have appropriated the quality elements". On the town which is very vast, there are about thirty lodgings, a beautiful hotel and four campsites.



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The village of Rouffignac, burned by the Germans on March 31, 1944 in retaliation for resistance actions, was rebuilt in millstone. His church had been spared. The town is also well known for its prehistoric cave called the Hundred Mammoths, which can be visited by small train.

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
